"One of my first memories was accompanying Paul to the supermarket where we spent at least 30mins organising the shelves and another 15mins making sure he had a copy of every single leaflet available whilst the others did the shopping - this would happen every time. You couldn't take Paul anywhere without him getting a leaflet!"

"I will always remember his big smile and his contagious laugh and how he always grabbed my hand to put on his face when I was in his apartment." "Paul's apartment had a budgie when they moved in, when staff cleaned the cage the budgie occasionally escaped Paul would laugh so loud, I think the whole of Rose Gardens could hear him."

"Paul often liked being in the centre of what was going on especially when the Fete was on."

"He enjoyed going on car rides over the hills and going to a cafe for tea and cake. Paul had a very wicked sense of humour."

Paul will be sadly missed by everyone who has had the pleasure of working with him over the years here at Rossendale.

On May 10th, Paul's Birthday, his family planted a tree in the grounds of Rossendale Hall for all to remember him. Paul's parents Ken and Sue, explained how much the Trust meant to him.

"We couldn't have wished for a better place for Paul to live. He was so happy during his time there. Rossendale is synonymous with Paul's life and we will be ever grateful for your wonderful care."

WorkTaste News

Samuel Knight commenced a Supported Internship from Park Lane School back in 2019.

After a much-interrupted placement at Macclesfield District General Hospital due to Covid, Samuel had proved himself a capable young man, quick with technology and particularly proficient at scanning patient files. This skill set led on to a paid placement at Berisfords Ribbons in Congleton.

the Accounts Department was rector, said, "Samuel works in a methodical way without any real assistance from the **Accounts Team."** Samuel's WorkTaste Coach, Jo Reed, has been impressed by how competent Samuel has become. Samuel was already confident with technology: using the scanner, saving PDF files, creating folders, etc. The elements Samuel struggled with initially, were the paper-based tasks: finding the relevant invoice in a large lever arch file, removing it to be scanned and then returning it back to the file. However, after the first few weeks, Samuel's dexterity much improved.

With over 100 colleagues, Samuel has had the opportunity to get to know a wide variety of staff during his placement. These include the Sales Department who he works alongside in a large open plan office, the IT manager who keeps upgrading his tech and at lunchtime, some of the staff who work in the factory.

Samuel will be finishing his placement at Easter. He said, "I can't believe it; the time has gone so quickly!" However, there will not be much time off for Samuel, as he starts work scanning files here at The Rossendale Trust soon! This will be a paid position for 11 hours per




