WorkTaste updates



Adam Hipwell is a keen supporter of Macclesfield Football Club where he has recently returned to commence a new Work-Taste placement.

Adam is working with Macclesfield Community Sports Trust who run Junior Football Tournaments with local schools in the Cheshire East area on a Wednesday afternoon. Adam helps with the pitch set up, wheeling the nets on to the pitch and manoeuvring them into the correct position. He sorts the bibs, cones and mats into separate colours for the different school teams and also takes footballs to each of the mini pitches that have been set up. Adam is growing in confidence each week.

Adam is developing his health and safety awareness; Lee Folkard, Head of Macclesfield FC Community Sports Trust has worked alongside Adam to show him how to move and position the heavy nets safely. He is also learning how the main pitch is divided into smaller pitches for the tournament and going forwards, Adam hopes to become more involved in setting these up. Danny Whitaker is a particular hero of Adam's and he has been fortunate to meet him during his placement. As Head of Player Development, Danny is responsible for the Academy training sessions that follow the Junior Tournaments. Adam has helped Danny and some of the Academy Coaches with preparing equipment and he loves to learn about all the different equipment that is used in these training sessions.

Adam's WorkTaste Coach, Lisa Miller, has been impressed with how he listens and follows instructions, uses initiative to organise the bibs by colour as well as into junior or adult sizes. 'Adam is thoroughly enjoying being part of the Macclesfield FC community, he always has a big smile on his face, is enthusiastic and willing to help with any task.'

All together the Trust had 6 participants in the run including Judith Nicholson, Fiona Howlett and Catherine Mitchell and collectively they raised over £5600 for the Trust. Thank you to everyone who took part and supported this event, it really was a memorable day for all.

And then a few weeks later we retuned to London to support our Marathon runners. Our team of 3 consisted of veteran marathon runner Torbjorn Eyre (Toby), Robert Kenyon and Frank Wadsworth. The event saw Toby complete his 20th London Marathon for the Trust, this year dressed as St George!

We were delighted to see all three runners safely cross the finish line and receive their well-earned medals. A huge achievement from them all as they collectively raised over £11,000 for the Trust. We are so very proud of everyone who took part and very grateful for the support they received. The money raised will help us to continue too support adults with learning disabilities in the workplace as part of our WorkTaste project.

Back to Macclesfield we headed a few weeks later, where local run club, the Rundamentalists, organised a





charity run with proceeds being donated to the Trust. Founder of the Rundamentalists and local PT Matthew Rigby set two challenging routes for the runners, starting and finishing at Rossendale Hall. A 9 km trail route headed up Tower Hill before the 5 km runners set off but they weren't given a easy route as they tackled the hills around Sutton. After the race it was back to Rossendale Hall for some well-earned refreshments including cakes baked by our Oakwood baking group. Runners also received a truckle of Cheshire Cheese kindly donated by the Cheshire Cheese Company. The event raised £1000 for the Trust - thank you to all involved and everyone who supported the event. We hope to welcome the Rundamentalists back to Rossendale Hall again in the future.
