Mining Tour



For many years now we have worked alongside volunteers and rangers from the National Trust at Alderley Edge and spent hours with our walking groups enjoying the paths and trails there, and on several occasions, we have bumped into groups that have been on tours down the mines organised by the Derbyshire Caving Club.

So we decided to give it a go ourselves and having made contact with the tour leader Bill a visit for the Oakwood group was arranged. The first stop was for the Day Service Manager to go and visit and risk assess the potential activity (he didn't need much persuading!). Following the risk assessment, we selected a group of 4 Oakwooders accompanied by a member of staff each to work one to one during the tour.

The group were kitted out with safety helmets and head lamps, something everyone enjoyed and it gave us the feeling of what lay ahead! After a short walk through the wood, we were met at the steel entrance door where the adventure began.

We walked along a narrow tunnel through to an open Chamber, where Bill gave a talk about the history of the mine and the methods used at the time to break the rocks. The group continued to weave their way through the tunnels to see several highlights, such as the beautiful colours formed from the ore in the rocks.

As we approached the exit, Bill stopped the group and asked them to take a deep breath as they went through the door. Under the ground there are no smells and as we walked out everyone took a deep breath and commented on the heightened smells of the air and the forest.

The tour lasted around an hour and was very informative and exceeded all expectations of everyone involved. Richard, one of the group said "I loved that, I've never done anything like that in my life"

Britain in Bloom

In early August, our tenants who volunteer at St Peter's Community Gardens as part of our WorkTaste program were invited to take part in 'Britian in Bloom' judging morning. Our tenants Stevie, Andy and Bobby accepted an invitation of tea and coffee and healthy sugar-free scones!

When the 'Britian in Bloom' judges arrived, they looked around the gardens and recognised all the hard work that our tenants have put in.

'Britian in Bloom is a national awards body celebrating the work of towns, cities and organisations in making their environment a better and greener place for people. They have a particular focus on community engagement so St Peter's was included in Macclesfield town's bid for an award.

We were very proud to have the St Peter's community garden included and were able to show how fabulously the partnership between them and the Trust works.

During the year people on Work-Taste, supported by their lovely coaches, work hard to prepare, sow, plant and harvest flowers and produce and we have a fine crop of tomatoes, beans, onions, potatoes, kale, strawberries and many other fruit and vegetables as a result.

After the judging, we all posed for a picture in front of the massive runner-bean plants!! Good luck to St Peter's Community Garden and thank you for letting us be part of your special morning!







September 2023 sees the start of the next cohort of Supported Interns.

The Trust works with education providers who have a Supported Internship programme to provide support to young adults between the ages of 16 – 24 years with an Education Health Care Plan (EHCP) and who are in their last year of education. Our WorkTaste Coaches help the individual with their transition into employment over a 39 week programme.

At the start of the programme, we offer 100% full support to the individual and this gradually reduces over time as the participant's independence and confidence increases.

This year we have 12 students being supported from Cheshire College South and West and Macclesfield College.

The placements are varied, as always, and include companies such as Shackleford Pianos, Knutsford Leisure Centre, Siemens, Proseal, Music Magpie, East Cheshire Hospice, Cyprotex, Alvaston Hall and Swansway garage.

Good luck to all of our supported interns and we look forward to reading about your progress in future issues of RossenTales.

Alex and Petty Pool



"Petty Pool in the community" is a new venture allowing young people access to various activities to improve life skills, confidence and to make new friends. Alex has been able to access activities based in Macclesfield led by Martin Bagnall, the coordinator. Alex attends these activities with PA Rebecca Norbury.

Alex was initially nervous and anxious about going to a new place and meeting new people. However, over time support from Martin and the Petty Pool staff and other service users Alex's confidence has grown and he's really happy to attend. Alex is always made to feel very welcome and included and his interests and wishes are taken into account. Over the past few months Alex has enjoyed using a laser printer to make his own sign, going out for coffee with his new friends, a trip in a minibus to Manchester Science and Industry Museum, ten pin bowling and Alex's highlight- having a go at Archery at Petty Pool college! After the archery activity on the way home Alex said, "I don't feel nervous going to Petty Pool anymore. I feel EXCITED." It is amazing to see Alex's confidence grow after his initial nerves and to see him participating in activities he had not done before, making new friends of a similar age and having lots of fun.

WorkTaste offer a PA service to anyone living in the wider community and provides one to one support to give people with learning disabilities and difficulties a chance to undertake activities that they chose and enjoy.

Life Long learning



Gareth Clifford's journey with the Guild for Lifelong Learning (GFLL) started back in January 2022 where he has been volunteering as a Catering Assistant in their community cafe. The GFLL is based in Wilmslow and work in partnership with Cheshire East to deliver education, health, and wellbeing programmes to improve the health, wellbeing, and fitness of the elderly, disadvantaged and people on low incomes and to reduce social isolation and improve quality of life.

Paula and Ali from the GFLL were keen to provide WorkTaste placements for several of our tenants to run alongside the delivery of their programmes. Gareth has been volunteering at GFLL for two hours a week carrying out various duties such as, loading and unloading the dishwasher, clearing and cleaning tables, refilling stock, polishing cutlery, taking food to customers at the table, making sandwiches and hoovering at the end of the shift. Gareth is very thorough when hoovering and moves all the tables and chairs in the café area and all the mats in the entrance hall.

Gareth has also completed an entry level food Hygiene Certificate and entry and level 1 Certificate in Health and Safety in the kitchen during his volunteering stint.

Gareth has become so proficient with his tasks, particularly the dishwasher, that it quickly became apparent that Gareth was a real asset to the Café. This has now resulted in an offer of paid employment for two hours each week. Gareth started his first paid shift on Friday 22nd September 2023. Gareth told us "I like working at the Guild and am happy with my paid job".

Gareth's new colleagues, tutors & students have a few words to say about him too:

"I'm thrilled to call Gareth my work colleague, he's worked extremely hard these last months and gained so many new skills, I can see his confidence shining. It's a delight to have you here each Friday, the cafe wouldn't function as well without you" - Alexandra
