Chair of Trustees Announces Retirement after 40 Years of Service



Moira Beswick, Chair of Trustees at the Trust, has announced her retirement after 40 years of dedicated service to the community. Moira's tenure as Chair spans 12 years, during which she utilized the managerial and HR skillsets acquired during her time working in senior management at ICI/Astra Zeneca.

Moira's commitment over the years has played a significant role in rebuilding the Trust to it's current position of strength where we now employ over 200 staff, who provide much needed support and services to adults with learning disabilities and complex care needs in our local area.

Under Moira's leadership, the Rossendale Trust has achieved a Good rating from the Care Quality Commission (CQC), with aspirations to now reach the Outstanding milestone.

Macclesfield MP and Patron of the Trust, David Rutley, has paid tribute to Moira's service, "Moira has been part of the fabric at the Rossendale Trust for decades. Her commitment and dedicated service were ever present during her 12 years serving as Chair of Trustees. Moira has always put the needs of tenants first and she should be rightly proud of all that the team

has achieved under her leadership. We are all very grateful for her hard work over many years and her amazing example".

Moira's successor has been confirmed as Adam Schofield, a former town councillor and Mayor of Macclesfield. Adam is looking forward to leading the Trust into the future and working with the Board and management team to continue in taking the Trust forward.

In recognition of Moira's retirement, the Trust's Board, at their annual AGM, granted her the title of Honorary President.

Steve Nichols, the Trust's CEO, expressed his gratitude for Moira's long - standing service. "Moira's commitment to the Trust has been unwavering and is a testament to her character. Moira has voluntarily given her time to support us to provide the best possible care for the people who use our services. It has been a pleasure to work alongside Moira during my time as Chief Executive and everyone here at the Trust wishes her a fulfilling and well-deserved retirement."

Moira's commitment to community services has also been honoured by the Macclesfield Castle Rotary Club, with the prestigious international award, The Paul Harris Fellowship. Moira is also a past recipient of the Mayor of Macclesfield's Pride of Macclesfield Award.

Alex has enjoyed seeing inside the aeroplanes, learning about what it was like to fly in them, as well as meeting retired aircrew and engineers.

"It's been great to support Alex in a new environment and see his experience broaden", said Sarah, "and I hope he'll be able to engage more fully in the future, learning new skills and continuing to enjoy the activities that Avro offers. The staff, who are all volunteers, have been so helpful and encouraging too."

Matt Todd – Scoop & Scales Shop Manager says, 'We are so pleased Alison continues to volunteer with us here at Scoop & Scales. She is part of the team now and we wouldn't be without her. He also shadowed members of the team before starting to do the job himself with the support of his coach.

In December, we were delighted to be joined by Tom who is also on a Supported Internship and supported by WorkTaste Coach, Sarah. Both of the students, have been warmly welcomed by the management team as well as their colleagues in the warehouse.

Both Luke and Tom are very grateful for the opportunities that they have been given, with Luke explaining, "I really enjoy working here and I want to hopefully prove myself and be considered for a job at the end of my placement'. Tom confirmed 'I am enjoying the experience at musicMagpie and really appreciate the opportunity to be in a working environment."

Sarah Ashton, Health & Safety Manager at musicMagpie explained to us what a difference the placements have made to them, "We first heard about the fabulous work that the Rossendale Trust do, when we were approached by Macclesfield College to host a placement. We had to consider what it would be like to have a student plus WorkTaste coach on site. We chose the Macclesfield site as it is a quieter environment and we worked with the coaches first to learn the role. We are very happy to be able to offer Tom and Luke the opportunity to gain workplace experience. The placements have really enhanced our workplace, we are all enjoying working with Luke, Tom and their coaches. We are looking forward to introducing them to the other departments here so that they can learn all aspects of the role."







Over the remainder of the academic year, Tom and Luke will continue with their placements and we look forward to seeing how they develop in their roles.


What inspired you to run the London Marathon for charity?
