



The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training



The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training on Learning Disability and Autism is named after Oliver McGowan, whose preventable death highlighted the need for health and social care staff to have better training. This standardised training was developed for this purpose and is the government's preferred and recommended training.

Oliver's Training looks to upskill the wider care workforce to provide appropriately adjusted care for people with a learning disability and autistic people. The aim is to save lives by promoting health inequality by ensuring the health and social care workforce have the right skills and knowledge to provide safe, compassionate and informed care to autistic people and people with a learning disability.

The Trust are working in Partnership with BeWell Learning and the local ICB to prepare our own facilitators and experts with lived experience of Autism and Learning Disabilities to co-deliver this new training course, which we plan to roll out over the next few months.

The Trust has provided the venue for one of these sessions and going forward we hope to be able to work alongside our trained Experts to provide this important training.

This is a huge national undertaking, and the Trust is dedicated to working alongside the NHS and Training providers to ensure that both ourselves and our colleagues across the sector have access to this training.

Robert's 60th


Robert Santon celebrated his 60th with a trip to Blackpool, a walk along the beach and fish & chips for his lunch.



WorkTaste

Celebrating Supported Internship Success!



During the academic year 2023/2024, The Rossendale Trust worked alongside Macclesfield College and Cheshire College South and West (CCSW) on their Supported Internship program.

This is an Acccess to Work funded 39 week program for students who are aged 16-24 and have an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) in their final year of education. Students are vocationally profiled by the colleges and a work placement is sourced that matches their interests. The Rossendale Trust then provide the colleges with WorkTaste coaches, to support the interns on their journey.

Students receive 100% support at the start, and as they progress and become more independent in their role, support reduces. Support is practical – supporting the intern to complete the job and tasks required but there is also emotional and social support as interns are supported with communication and interpersonal skills, helping them to interact with colleagues and understand the ethos of the workplace.

We are delighted to share news that five interns have successfully gained employment at the end of the program.

From Macclesfield College, one student gained a five day a week contract at Proseal, another signed a contract of employment with Music Magpie and a third student was offered an apprenticeship at the college.

Two students from CCSW have also gained employment – a part time role for one student at Alvaston Hall, Crewe and a full-time position at Swansway Accident Repair Centre for the other.

Huge congratulations to all the interns who have progressed through the program and well done on securing employment - it really is a wonderful achievement! For those that didn't receive job offers, they walk away after gaining valuable experiences and new skills that can now hopefully be transferred to a new workplace.

End of Season Performance

The Drama and Musical Theatre sessions aim to provide adults with learning disabilities with the opportunity to gain confidence and improve their social skills through fun games and activities. The groups sing, dance, and act their way through famous musicals such as Grease, The Greatest Showman and Joseph & The Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat. The teacher selects extracts from musicals that she knows the participants will love. Each session, they play group drama games, learn scripts from famous scenes and get active with a dance routine.

During the four-month activity cycle the groups practice skits, group performances, group improvisations and solos, working up towards a performance to family and friends on the last session of the rota.







This last run ended with a mash up of performances from Mamma Mia, The Lion King and Snow White. Ben, who recently joined the Musical Theatre group said of his most recent performance "I did a scene from The Lion King, I learnt one and a half pages of a script and did a solo performance to the audience. I liked that I had the confidence to push myself to get up on stage and perform, a few years ago I just couldn't have done it."

Laura, the Activity Leader for the sessions explains how fun and rewarding the sessions are "Roxy, the tutor, does an excellent job of adapting the sessions to be fully inclusive to all that attend. It's been amazing to see the changes in people from when they first come. It's such a wonderful day, most of the time it just feels like one big party!"

Trevor, is a regular in our Media groups and he told us about his favourite part of the process "I like taping on and removing the transfers from the mugs and coasters when they have been pressed, I like that I can get involved"
