Wiltshire



Poynton High School & Makaton




We were recently invited to Poynton High school to be involved in a student development day helping to educate their Year 8 students about positive relationships, specifically with people with learning disabilities or autism.

Jason Blythe (Oakwood Activities Manager) and Zoe Williams (Family Liaison Manager) introduced the students to Rossendale, explaining the work that we do. They then went on to talk about learning disabilities and autism before running interactive sessions to better equip the students in communication and to increase their empathy, understanding and confidence when they meet someone with a learning disability or autism.

Students got involved in playing charades and learnt some Makaton signs to aid their communication. These exercises really made them think about how they would feel if they were not able to communicate through speech.

Thank you to the staff and students for welcoming us to the school. We hope everyone took something positive and useful away from the sessions.

WorkTaste

New Supported Intern Cohort 2024 - 2025

September 2024 saw a new cohort of Supported Interns. The 39-week, DWP funded education program, is designed for students aged 16-24 with an Education, Health, and Care Plan (EHCP) in their final year of education. The program is designed to assist with the transition from education to work.

Support is high initially and is designed to reduce as the student becomes more confident by displaying independence.

We will be supporting fifteen young students from Macclesfield College, Cheshire College South & West (Crewe Campus) and for the first time this year, students from Reaseheath College. Students are taking up a variety of different placements across a wide range of industries including catering, IT, warehouse work, childcare, education, scientific research, leisure industry, farming, finance and retail – the list goes on. We have supported sixty-five students since 2019, and we are incredibly proud to be able to provide quality 1:1 job coaching for this program.

We know from our past experiences that the chances of these young people gaining meaningful employment at the end of their internships is incredibly high. We look forward to following the progress of this year's students and will of course keep you updated on how they are doing.

Duncan's rushed off his feet at the Church House



New landlords Sean and Kristen Lucey took over the Church House Inn in Sutton in 2024 and we were delighted when they agreed to host a WorkTaste placement for us.

Duncan went to meet the team and having been shown around he was keen to start work. He started his placment in August and some of his responsibilities include sorting and polishing cutlery, taking orders, serving orders to the customers and housekeeping. Duncan is very attentive and likes to check in with the customers and ask, 'Is everything ok with your meal?'

Duncan's WorkTaste Coach, Marie, said, 'Duncan is getting to know the regulars, in fact two ladies that come in most weeks have commented to me how well Duncan is doing and how much he has improved with his tasks over the weeks. I hear lots of feedback from people saying how great it is that Duncan gets this opportunity.'

Some weeks are extremely busy, but Duncan takes it all in his stride.

In September 2021 Barry started his placement at The Lighthouse Charity Shop in Buxton and three years on he is still enjoying his time there . Once a week he is responsible for preparing the stock, putting price stickers on paper tags, checking DVDs and CDs, tidying up bookshelves and arranging displays for toys. Lately, he is also managing to check clothes sizes and find the right marker to put on hangers.

In the three years Barry has rarely missed a shift. He enjoys doing something purposeful, being part of the team and having a laugh with his colleagues. He is engaging with people when working in the front room of the shop. His favorite moments are meeting the customers who visit with their dogs; this absolutely makes his day!

In November 2022 Barry was joined at the shop by another Buxton tenant, Neil. Neil settled straight into his tasks and started off with cleaning the shelves. He then moved on to preparing clothes for sale by checking the size labels, putting them on hangers with the right size marker, sticking gift aid stickers on price tags and tidying up the room before finishing his placement.

Neil is always looking forward to his weekly placement at The Lighthouse and his confidence has developed well over the last year. He is willing to do any task, and he loves to engage with the staff and customers.

Oakwood

Bosley Locks





The Wednesday Oakwood Grounds Maintenance group work in conjunction with the Canal and Rivers Trust. The group have been tasked with the maintenance of the series of 12 canal locks at Bosely. Working alongside staff and volunteers from the Canal and River Trust they are responsible for making the locks a safe sustainable environment and preserving the area's natural beauty. The work involves painting and oiling the series of lock gates, trimming back hedges alongside the tow path, laying fresh grit down to restore the tow path and maintaining and developing a garden at lock 5.

Rachel Hine, Oakwood Activity Leader for the Grounds Maintenance group said "The leaders at the Canal and River Trust are great, very patient with the group, the whole experience is really enjoyable, the group love to watch the canal barges passing through the locks".



Squash



We were recently approached by Aron Robinson from Calder Community Squash, a nonprofit community organisation which aims to bring the racket ball game of squash to a wider audience. With the help of funding from Sport England, we were invited to take part in some taster sessions focusing particularly on inclusivity.

Teaming up with Chris Ogden from Inspire Squash, a group of four Oakwood attendees went to the local leisure centre. The sessions focused on warming up properly, development of hand to eye coordination, teamwork, handling of the racket and movement.

It was a roaring success and the team enjoyed every second of it, with everyone asking "when are we doing it again?"

Sam said "It was fantastic! I enjoyed hitting the ball off the wall and passing it to Adam".

Jason Blythe, Oakwood activities manager agreed "What a wonderful morning it was, Chris did a great job welcoming the group in and tailoring the activities so that everyone could take part. It was brilliant to see everyone getting involved in a new activity and in a new environment. I would really like to add this to our programme of activities in the future. Big thank you to Aron and Chris for making it happen".

A windfall of Apple Juice



For a few years now, the Oakwood Horticulture group have been planting apple trees around the site. We have often used the produce to make delicious puddings in our cookery groups. This year however, Activity Leader Laura came up with a different approach!

Laura contacted High Peak Cider, a local company that produces apple juice and cider to see if there was any way in which we could collaborate and make the most of our huge harvest.

Laura explains "With the help of Joe from High Peak Cider, the Oakwood gardening team set out to collect apples from the numerous trees across the site to make some fresh apple juice. The grounds are home to a variety of different types of apple trees planted over the years, and the assorted apples harvested are perfect for making fresh apple juice.

The team used specialist apple pickers provided by High Peak Cider. Tenant Andy was particularly taken with the telescopic apple picker used to reach the apples from the top of the trees. The rest of the team worked hard collecting the apples by hand from the different trees that they could reach.

Despite the terrible weather, hundreds of apples were collected and taken back to the cabin, where Joe had supplied an apple mulcher and juicer. The mulcher was quite noisy, so hearing protectors were provided by Joe to make sure everyone felt comfortable taking part in the activity. The team worked hard, washing and putting the apples into the mulcher to create a thick apple mulch. The fresh smell of apples was delicious. The mulched apples were then placed into the juicer. Assisted by the team and under the guidance of Joe, the handle was turned to crush the apples and collect fresh apple juice in the bucket below.

Everyone in the gardening group was able to assist in the activity, from collection to juicing. The final product was a beautiful and fresh bucket of apple juice. As the fresh juice had not been pasteurised, Joe very kindly brought in some bottles of apple juice he had made at Random Apple HQ, where High Peak Cider is based. This had been pasteurised and was safe to drink. He even bought in some sparkling juice to make apple spritzers. Despite the torrential rain, the team had a fantastic morning harvesting and enjoying spritzers. Thanks Joe!"

Inclusive website

When we launched our new website back in 2023, it was important to us that the users journey was inclusive and the site was as accessible as it could possibly be, after all every website user deserves an inclusive online experience.

After much research we were delighted to be able to add the Recite Me toolbar to our website. With customisable options which allow the user to choose how they navigate and consume information in the best way possible for them, the toolbar really has opened up our site to more visitors.

Some of the features include;

- Screen Readers to assist those with visual impairments. Website text can be read aloud and customised to suit the user
- Translation the technology translates content into over 100 languages and 65 text to speech voices
- Styling & Customisation Recite Me allows users to change the way the website looks with users able to customise colour scheme, text, font, style, size, colour and spacing
- Reading Aids the toolbar provides six main tools ruler, screen mask, magnifier, margins, page summariser and a dictionary to simplify and support those visitors for whom reading content on line can be a challenge
